## SEEKING THE SAVIOR

## Matthew 2:1-13

## INTRODUCTION

A. Rudolph the Red-Nose Reindeer

1. Rudolph, Yukon Cornelius, and Hermey were all searching for fame, fortune and happiness.
2. Not unlike so many in the world today.
B. But what is really important?
3. Jesus - Luke $10: 42$, only a few things...
4. Paul - Acts 17:25-27, should seek the Lord.
5. David - Psalm 63:1, seek God earnestly.
6. Moses - Deut. 4:29, seek with all your heart will find Him.
C. There was a group of men who searched for Jesus "with all their heart" (2 Chron.

15:12).

1. The wise men searched for Jesus.
2. The wise men found Jesus.
3. Their lives were better as a result.

## I. THEY SOUGHT JESUS.

A. The Magi, Matthew 2:1.

1. "Magi" is the word from which we get "magic" or "magician".
a. They were noted for their knowledge and perception [wise men].
b. They had a reputation for being wise and often served as advisors to kings.
c. But to our knowledge were not kings. Psalm 68:29; 72:10-11, 15.
2. It is widely accepted that there were three "wise men".
a. Based on the giving of "three gifts", vs. 11.
b. The word "magi" is plural, so at least 2, but as many as a dozen or more.
3. The "magi" came from the east [from the rising of the sun].
a. Some suggest Arabia, Persia, Chaldea or Parthia.
c. Persia may be the better guess - magi flourished there.
4. The magi were probably Gentiles.
a. Based on their question as to the "Where ... King of the Jews", vs. 2.
b. They could have been dispersed Jews (I.e., Daniel, Jews identified in Acts 2).
**5. Anyone seeking Jesus is truly wise, because they are seeking the "King of kings, and Lord of lords", Rev. 19:16.
B. The Mission, Matthew 2:2.
5. Their mission was specific - "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews?"
6. They came for the purpose of worshiping Him, Mt 2:2b.
7. He was not just the "King of the $\boldsymbol{J} \boldsymbol{e w s}$ ", but also their king.
**4. There is no sacrifice too great in our search for Jesus.
a. True spiritual blessings are found only in Christ, Eph. 1:3.
b. And the Lord rewards those who diligently [implied] seek Him, Heb. 11:6.
C. The Method, Matthew 2:2-6.
8. How did they even come to know about Jesus?
a. If Gentiles, they would not have known of Jesus, the king of the Jews.
b. Perhaps they had heard from Jews (scattered all over the world).
9. But how did they know how to find Jesus?
a. "We saw His star in the east", vs. 2.
b. Some believe the star was a natural phenomenon.
i. Johannes Kepler, conjunction of planets Saturn, Jupiter and Mars allowed star to be visible.
ii. Karl Wieseler, recorded appearance of new star.
iii. Halley's Comet appeared around 11 B.C.
c. J.W. McGarvey concluded, "But all this put together cannot account for the visit of the magi. They were guided directly by God, and nothing else.
**3. To find Jesus today:
a. God will help us find Him, if we are willing to search.
b. Must be willing to accept God's guidance. Jer. 10:23; Is. 1:18
c. Must be ready to follow it - at once.
d. Must remain humble, Jas. 4:6. Willing to ask questions, vs. vs. 2.
e. They still needed the Word, Mt. 2:5, 6; Jn. 5:39; Jas. 1:21; 2 Tim. 3:15.
**4. The path to follow:
a. Believe, John 3:16; Mark 16:16.
b. Repent, Lk. 13:3, 5.
c. Confess, Mt. 10:32.
d. Be baptized, Jn. 3:3; Mt. 28:19.
e. Live faithfully, Rev. 2:10.

## II. THEY FOUND JESUS.

A. When they found Jesus, they rejoiced.

1. Mt. 2:7-9a - south from Jerusalem to Bethlehem.
2. They rejoiced when the saw the star, Mt. 2:10.
3. There they saw the Child with Mary, Mt. 2:11.
B. When we find Jesus.
4. When we seek in the right way, with the right attitude, God will help.
5. Ethiopian eunuch, Acts $8: 39$, "...went on his way rejoicing."
**3. Rejoice "with joy inexpressible and full of glory" (1 Pet. 1:8).
