THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD Psalm 119:137-144

INTRODUCTION

- A. Characteristics of God.
 - 1. What characteristic stands out to you?
 - 2. Do we think on His mercy and grace, love, power, holiness, etc.
- B. A Relationship with God.
 - 1. Throughout Psalm 119, the psalmist longs for a relationship with God.
 - a. This is based on a knowledge of God through His word.
 - b. He longs for God's Word to guide.
 - 2. On what is your relationship with the Lord based?
 - a. Is it based on your attendance or Bible knowledge?
 - b. Is it based on how "good" you are each day?

I. THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD.

- A. God Is Righteous.
 - 1. Vs. 137, "Righteous art Thou, O Lord, ...".
 - a. This is not describing the actions of God, but His very being.
 - b. In Hebrew, righteous and faithful are very similar.
 - 2. Faithfulness and truthfulness is consistent with His nature and promises.
 - a. 1 Kings 8:56 Solomon's dedication of the temple.
 - b. "...not one word has failed of all His [God's] promise, which He promised through Moses His servant."
 - 3. The thought is that God is righteous and man is not, Job 4:17.
 - 4. And because of God's righteousness, He expects His people to be righteous.
 - a. "Be holy...", Lev. 11:44 (cf. 1 Peter 1:16).
 - b. Romans 6:13
- B. Judgments of God.
 - 1. Vs. 137b, "And upright are Your judgments."
 - 2. We will all stand before the throne of God, Romans 2:6.
 - a. It will not be guess work as to salvation.
 - b. We know the answer, because we know His righteousness.
 - c. Band contests never sure how the judge will rule (subjective).
 - 3. God will judge according to His Word which is righteous.
 - a. John 12:48, "...the word I spoke is what will judge him at the last day."
 - b. Not according to our judgments and desires.
- C. Testimonies [Law] of God.
 - 1. Vs. 138, "You have commanded Your testimonies in righteousness and exceeding faithfulness."
 - 2. God's law is righteous [right], Psalms 19:7-9.
 - 3. We don't have to worry about "changing" laws.
 - a. Perfect, sure, right, pure, true.
 - b. In our society, laws tend to change to fit our times and ways.
 - c. Sports games, "rules" change over time.
 - 4. God's ways stay the same.
 - a. What was wrong with Israel then is still wrong today.
 - b. God is no shifting shadow, Jas. 1:17.
 - c. Hebrews 13:8, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, yes and forever."

- D. God Is Eternal.
 - 1. Vs. 142, "Your righteousness is an everlasting righteousness."
 - 2. Dynasties.
 - a. The Babylonian Empire about 90 years.
 - b. The Ming Dynasty about 276 years.
 - c. The Romans Empire about 1500 years.
 - 3. God is everlasting.
 - a. Isaiah 51:6-8
 - b. Revelation 1:8; 21:6; 22:13, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end."

II. MY RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD.

- A. My Zeal.
 - 1. Vs. 139, "My zeal has consumed me, because my adversaries have forgotten Your words."
 - a. Consumed is to be exhausted.
 - b. The psalmist is saying that my strength is gone, because....
 - 2. Zeal for God's house, John 2:17 (cf. Psalms 69:9).
 - 3. We grow tired, but is it because of zeal?
 - a. Galatians 6:9
 - b. 2 Peter 3:14
 - c. Philippians 3:9-10
- B. My Love.
 - 1. Vs, 140, "Your word is very pure, therefore Your servant loves it."
 - 2. Do we have a true love for the Lord?
 - a. Psalms 119:10-11
 - b. Philippians 1:9 Paul's prayer for the church.
 - c. 1 John 5:3 (love *for* God, NIV).
- C. My Delight.
 - 1. Vs. 143b, "Your commandments are my delight."
 - 2. Is our delight in the Lord?
 - a. Psalms 37:4
 - b. Psalms 40:8
 - c. Matthew 5:6
- D. My Understanding.
 - 1. Vs. 144b, "Give me understanding that I may live."
 - 2. Our daily prayer should be to know God's righteousness.
 - a. Ephesians 3:14-19
 - b. Colossians 1:9-10
 - c. 1 John 5:20-21
 - 3. Not only to "know" His righteousness, but to have the same.
